

Rating tests are intended to recognize achievement and increase enjoyment of Pony Club members by encouraging increased confidence, independence and good safety habits. Rating test should be a positive educational experience. Members should be encourage to progress at a pace that is comfortable for them. **Riding is a hobby, something we do for fun.** 

## Certification Update 2016

- Nearly 2/3rds of Region members are Unrated or D certified (64% - this excludes HMX) Region Camp should be 'revived' with focus for Ds.
- Percentages of Nationally certified, A-C3 members, 7% and C certified members 28% are stable. There was slight shift year to year (up 2% on C1, down 1% on C2s)
- Carolina Region hosted 3 national certification tests with more than 30 candidates from multiple regions. Congratulations to our new HBs, HAs, C3s, and Bs!
- Local instruction and certifications are important in all clubs. Clubs should offer rating opportunity 2x per year. Jointly with neighbor club and Region tests are fine.
- The purpose of certifications is to enhance the pony club experience.
- Don't pressure kids for ratings. Relieve peer pressure if you can.
- Rally teams and riding groups are flexible with regard to ratings.



# Rally Round up 2016



- Rally participation was very low in 2015 averaging about 40 competitors per rally. This is not a sustainable level.
- 50 competitors per rally is about breakeven depending on fixed facility cost and entry fee budgeted
- 2016 participation is improved with average participation about 70 (excludes games, tet, plx).
- 2016 Rallies were profitable. Rally profits go to organizing club up to \$500, balance goes to Region for education and championships
- Club leadership and organization of rallies is important to their success.

# Horse Management Update

DIFFERENTIATOR: Unique features and/or benefits of a product, or aspects of a brand, that set it apart from competing products or brands. HM IS WHAT MAKES PONY CLUB DIFFERENT !

- Horse Management is the Pony Club 'Differentiator'
- HM is the essence of making a true 'Horseman', not just a rider
- George Morris, among others, bemoans the lack of horsemanship in today's participants in horse sport.
- Role of the Horse Management Organizer (HMO) is critical
  - Regional and Club HM instruction: work with the RIC to provide instructors and materials
  - HM Staff for Rallies: Develop group of knowledgeable, trained HM staff (parents and older members)
  - Region Competition: work with Rally Organizers on CHMJ, staffing, facilities and HM paperwork
- · 2016 learning was through our clubs and rallies
- Need HM education in clubs and Region events
- New HMOs proposed
  - My pony club story Judith and SuSu Shoemaker 1970s
  - Recent Pony Club grads C2/HB and C3D/H
  - North and South Dronzek/Jacobs

# **Region Policy Update**

- Carolina Region Policy Update October 2016
- These are changes suggested and requested by USPC Vice President of Regional Administration. They are simplifications and clarifications to align our policy with USPC policy and other Regions.
- Full policy and change details were emailed to all Region Council members in advance of the meeting for review and comment.

#### SUMMARY OF CHANGES

Active Club/Center – grammar correction "respond" should be "responds"

**Regional Membership Fee :** Delete 'Current fee' sentence. Fee will be voted in the annual meeting and recorded in the minutes. Policy change will not be required to adjust fee in the future.

Delete 'Club, Center and Horsemasters' so that sentence simply says 'members'.

**Education Fund**: Delete 'Current fee' sentence. Add "The fee will be determined and approved by the Region Council at the Annual Meeting." Fee will be voted in the annual meeting and recorded in the minutes. Policy change will not be required to adjust fee in the future.

USPC championship fund : Income from rallies, Add "a portion of Income from rallies, to be determined annually at the Annual Meeting."

Education : Standards and Certification – delete 'Policy 3015' reference to USPC policy not needed.

Change 'DCs' to 'leaders'; change 'pony clubbers' to 'members'; delete 'their'

**National Certifications** :Add 'and keep the fee within USPC guidelines.' At end of sentence. Must keep fee within maximum amount allowed by USPC. Currently \$175.

Special Awards/Honors : Add 'as funds allow.' To end of sentence
